Born Again: By His Grace, For His Glory

Gospel Identity

EPHESIANS 2:1-10

Overview

The book of Ephesians is all about identity: who we are and how we should live because of who we are. After celebrating our identity in Christ in chapter 1, Ephesians 2:1-10 reminds us of who we were before Christ and how our identity has been transformed. *How can children of wrath become children of God?* The answer to that question unfolds through four key phrases: You were... But God... By grace... We are.

- 1. You Were... Dead in Sin (vv. 1-3)
 - a. The Way of the World
 - b. The Influence of the Devil
 - c. The Passions of the Flesh
- 2. **But God...** Made Us Alive with Christ (vv. 4-7)
 - a. Rich Mercy
 - b. Great Love
 - c. Immeasurable Grace

- 3. **By Grace...** You have been Saved (vv. 8-9)
 - a. By Grace
 - b. Through Faith
- 4. We Are... God's Workmanship (v. 10)
 - a. Created for Good Works
 - b. Walk in Good Works (4:1, 17; 5:2, 8, 15)

Reflection Questions

- 1. If you are not a Christian, what is keeping you from accepting God's gift of salvation?
- 2. If you are a Christian, how would you explain the gospel from this passage (in one minute or less!) to someone who is not a Christian?
- 3. Why does Paul paint such a grim picture of our identity apart from God?
- 4. What good works has God prepared for us to walk in? (Explore the rest of Ephesians for ideas, starting with 4:1, 17; 5:2, 8, 15.)
- 5. Where are you most aware of your need for the Spirit's power to help you walk that way?

Prayer Prompts

- 1. Praise God for his rich mercy, great love, and immeasurable grace!
- 2. Confess to God where you are still walking in old ways instead of in the good works he has created you for in Jesus.
- 3. Ask God to strengthen you with power through his Spirit (Eph 3:16) so you can walk in the good works he has prepared for you.
- 4. Ask God to save people you know who are still "children of wrath."
